Aircraft Maintenance

**CIVIL AIR PATROL AIRCRAFT MAINTENANCE MANAGEMENT**

CAPR 66-1, dated 1 February 2000, is supplemented as follows:

**4.** Custodial units must coordinate with Texas Wing Maintenance (LGM) before scheduling or completing any preventive or unscheduled maintenance on a Texas Wing aircraft. Use of designated consolidated aircraft maintenance facilities is mandatory.

**8.b.** All 100 hour inspections should be completed as Annual Inspections.

**11.h.** Aircraft survival kits will contain sufficient items to sustain 3-4 people for a period of 3 days. The kits will contain items for protection (tube tents, space blankets and sleeping blankets); emergency drinking water or water purification tablets, emergency rations, multifunction survival knife, signal mirror, emergency lights to include a flashlight and glow sticks, waterproof matches, survival candle, fire starting material, fishing line, wire saw, lensatic compass, whistle, and items for personal care such as toilet tissue, toothpaste, soap, trash disposal bags, etc. The kit will also contain a medium size First Aid Kit with the following items included: various sizes of adhesive bandages, sterile pads, alcohol pads, gauze bandages, adhesive tape, cotton balls, bacterial ointment, antiseptic swabs, aspirin or non-aspirin pain relief tablets, and latex gloves. Survival kits are contained in either one bag or two backpacks. Custodial units shall inspect the survival kit at each 100 hour/annual inspection and ensure there are no missing or expired items in the kit. Expired items will be replaced by the custodial unit.

**14.** Units may not charge more than the hourly rate specified in CAPR 173-3.

**14.b.** Each custodial unit must complete and submit a Texas Wing Monthly Flying Report to Texas Wing Headquarters and to Texas Wing Maintenance by the 5th of the following month. The custodial unit is responsible for collecting and paying to Texas Wing all monies due for non-reimbursable (B and C) mission hours flown each month. Each custodial unit is responsible for paying any hangar rent and for routine aircraft expenses such as cleaning supplies, survival kit expired items, and recharging fire extinguishers.
