Volunteer Civil Air Patrol serves during times of war, peace

WASHINGTON – U.S. Representative Richard Hanna (R-NY), along with Representative Charlie Dent (R-PA), Representative Steve Israel (D-NY), and Representative Ron Kind (D-WI), has introduced a resolution recognizing the strategic role the Civil Air Patrol plays in supporting critical defense and homeland security missions and honoring the organization for 75 years of continuous service in times of both peace and war. U.S. Senator Susan Collins (R-Maine) has also introduced a companion resolution in the Senate.

House Resolution 925 recognizes members of the all-volunteer Civil Air Patrol who served prominently during World War II, engaging in coastal patrols for enemy vessels, search and rescue missions, courier and cargo services, and air defense and pilot training operations. It is estimated that CAP pilots flew 24 million miles over 18 months and reported more than 170 possible submarines sightings. The Civil Air Patrol's World War II legacy also includes the integration of its squadrons, which were the first to allow both women and African Americans to fly in service to their country. H.Res. 925 has nearly 60 cosponsors in the House of Representatives.
